
## Expression of faith and spirituality in diversity

The month of November is a special time when we remember all those who have 'fallen asleep in the peace of Christ'. - those who taught us good things and made sacrifices for us.
- those who prayed for us while they were on this earth.
- the most forgotten souls.
- those who had great responsibilities while they were on earth.

Let us all wish that these people are saved, having been purified, and they can be with God, face to face.

## Liturgy corner

### The Introductory Rites

The Introductory Rites of the Mass include the:

- entrance song
- greeting
- penitential act (incl. the Confiteor) or blessing and sprinkling of holy water (especially during the Easter season).
- Gloria and
- Collect.

The purpose of the Introductory Rites is to gather us as a worshipping community and prepare us to listen to God's word and celebrate the Eucharist worthily. The Entrance song begins the Mass and announces that we are there to worship God as members of the Body of Christ so for that reason, it is very important that we all join in the singing of this song.

### All Saints Day

On All Saints Day, we remember those who are in the presence of God, who enjoy union with God. There are many saints known and unknown to us and to the church. We also know many who lived among us as saints and died and who now may be with God. **On 1<sup>st</sup> November, we specially remember and honour all of them.**

The saints in heaven are a glorious band of people who have lived this life with such love; they have been both heroes and ordinary people. Some have inspired the church for centuries, and other unsung heroes have lived a quiet life of family, work and friendship in the spirit of the Gospel as peacemakers, pure of heart and gentle of spirit.

On All Saints' Day each of us would do well to think of the many good people who have crossed our path and enriched our lives – parents, classmates, parishioners and friends. They were not perfect, but they were in their own way great human beings.

### Notes for Ministers and Altar servers

- The extra ordinary minister of Holy Communion who brings the Communion to the Altar may bring it immediately before the prayer, "This is the Lamb of God" (at the end of the prayer Lamb of God you take away the sins....)
